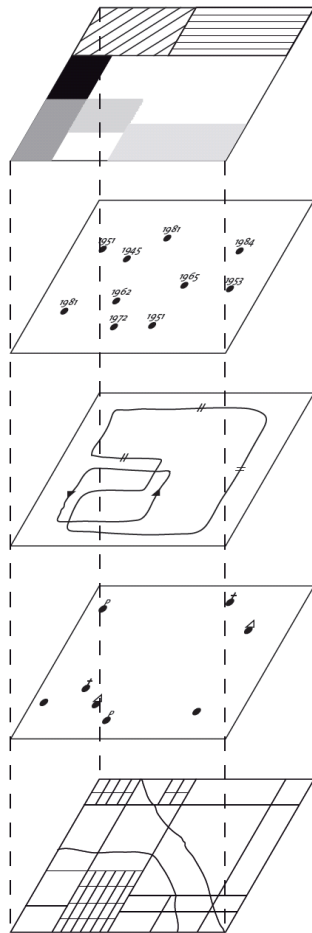


## WORKSHOP

# GIS FOR HISTORICAL RESEARCH



**Date:**

Tuesday 13 May, 9:30 am – 4:30 pm

This one day workshop will provide participants with an introduction to the application of Geographic Information Systems (GIS) to historical research. Co-taught by computer scientists and historians, the workshop will explore how historical data can be managed, visualised and analysed through ArcGIS. Participants will learn about the range of academic resources available for Historical GIS and through exercises on geo-referencing, visualisation and spatial analysis will be able to develop a case-study based on their own research material.
